


**DISABILITY BENEFIT SPECIALIST PROGRAM**

**WE CAN HELP**

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The Disability Benefit Specialist (DBS) is a person employed by the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) who provides information about public and private benefit programs- including assistance with application and appeal procedures.

The DBS provides services to people ages 18 to 59 with physical disabilities, developmental disabilities, mental illness and substance use disorders.

The DBS works closely with information and assistance, options counseling, and other resource center services.

*All services provided by the Disability Benefit Specialist Program are Free of Charge. Interpreter services can also be arranged.*

## **WE CAN HELP:**

- Provide accurate information on public and private benefits and programs;
- Determine which benefits and programs you may be entitled to as well as which programs might best meet your needs;



- Fill out applications for benefits, programs and services;
- Provide assistance in obtaining or retaining benefits and services;
- Provide referrals, assistance and support on other matters including disability rights and the impact of earnings on financial eligibility for public benefits;
- Provide assistance with formal appeals related to denials of eligibility, termination of benefits or overpayment of public and private benefits.
